I. Call to Order

The members of the Brookfield City Council met November 22, 2022. The meeting was called to order by Mayor Lonnie Trentham at 5:30 p.m. at City Hall.

IV. Approval of Minutes

A motion made by Wessing seconded by Frey to approve the October, 2022 minutes. Motion carried 5-0.

V. Monthly Financial Report

Due to fiscal year end October financial reports were not available at the time of the meeting.

VI. Update from Main Street Board

Donna Hulett spoke on behalf of the board. A Façade Improvement Application has been established for Main Street businesses as funding options for exterior building improvements.

The Board worked with Regional MO Bank and the Linn Country Area Career Center welding students to create a Christmas tree for the oval.

A. Consideration of an Ordinance between the Missouri Highways & Transportation Commission and Cities of Marceline and Brookfield for Airfield Pavement Maintenance

A motion was made by Forbes, seconded by Techau to read Bill #22-11 for the second time by title only, motion carried 5-0. Bill was read.

A motion to pass Bill #22-11, to be known as Ord. #22-10, was made by Wessing, seconded by Frey, and carried 5-0.

II. Miscellaneous matters from the City Manager

Joe Wheeler at 709 Lincoln requested the assessment costs be removed. The assessments were originally applied from the prior owner. After discussion, Frey made a motion and seconded by Wessing to approve the request. Motion carried 5-0.

Wessing addressed concerns regarding the ongoing "yard sale" on South Monroe Street. In addition, the 200 block of Hyatt Street is in need of repair caused from prior water breaks.
