MINUTES OF BROOKFIELD CITY COUNCIL August 26, 2025 5:30 PM – City Hall

I. Call to Order

The members of the Brookfield City Council met August 26, 2025. The meeting was called to order by Mayor Paul Frey at 5:30 P.M. at City Hall.

II. Pledge of Allegiance

III. Roll Call

Council members present: Sarah Wessing, Richard Techau, Jordan Clements, Lonnie Trentham and Mayor Paul Frey. Also present: Dana Tarpening, City Manager, Tanya Sportsman, City Clerk, Police Chief, Joel Dixon, and City Attorney, Robert Cowherd.

IV. Approval of Minutes

A motion made by Wessing seconded by Trentham to approve the July 2025 City Council meeting minutes. Motion carried 5-0.

V. Monthly Financial Report

A motion was made by Trentham and seconded by Wessing to approve the July financials. Motion carried 5-0.

VI. Public Hearing – 2025 Tax Levy

Mayor Frey called the public hearing to order. The 2024 tax levy was \$1.493; the 2025 tax levy is proposed at \$1.499. There were no comments or objections. Mayor Frey closed the public hearing.

VII. New Business

A. Consideration of an Ordinance concerning the 2025 tax levy

A motion was made by Trentham and seconded by Techau to read Bill #25.10 for the first time by title only, motion carried 5-0. Bill was read.

A motion was made by Techau and seconded by Wessing to read Bill #25.10 for the second time by title only, motion carried 5-0. Bill was read.

A motion to pass Bill #25.10, to be known as Ord. #25.08, was made by Trentham and seconded by Techau, and carried 5-0.

B. Consideration of 2023-2024 Audit

The City received copies of the 2023-2024 Audit and John Gillum spoke at the City Council meeting to review the audit with the Council. A motion was made by Trentham, seconded by Wessing.

C. Consideration of propane, diesel and gas bids

A motion was made by Wessing and seconded by Techau to approve the propane bid submitted by Ferrellgas at \$1.35 gallon and bid submitted by MFA Oil at the price of \$3.49/gallon of diesel and NL gasoline for \$2.83/gallon. The MFA delivery cost of \$2.50/gallon of diesel and \$2.17/gallon for NL gasoline. Motion carried 5-0.

D. Consideration of requests from Planning and Zoning Board

The consideration was tabled for the next scheduled meeting.

E. Consideration of an Ordinance concerning Tiny Homes

The consideration was tabled for the next scheduled meeting.

F. Consideration of a Proclamation concerning U.S. Constitution Week

Mayor Frey declared September 17 through 23 as U.S. Constitution Week.

Don Johnson expressed his concerns to Council and the Police Chief on the issues with drivers driving by his home on E North and E Prairie street at high speeds.

Tarpening requested that Melissa, with the Housing Authority, be invited to speak regarding the opportunity to support the remodeling of the Brookfield Village Apartments.

XI. Miscellaneous matters from City Council
